QTEL Professional Development Institutes

- **QTEL Disciplinary Literacy Institutes:** provide scaffolding instruction within the context of core disciplines of study in both secondary and elementary: English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Beginning ESL, and Spanish Literacy
